Councilman Herreshoff asked that the Town Solicitor cite a single instance where a bond was not fully drawn down. He noted that while this request is for a large sum of money, this is a big step forward, and that the library has been an important part of the fabric of the town and has served it well. He called the management and staffing outstanding, noting that the addition could last for many years and is in the "best interest of the residents of Bristol."
