1. ENVIRONMENTAL
MANAGEMENT BONDS
\$34,000,000
(CHAPTER 55 - PUBLIC LAWS 2000)

Approval of this question will authorize the State of Rhode Island to issue general obligation bonds and refunding bonds in an amount not to exceed \$34,000,000 for environmental and recreational purposes, specifically, the acquisition of open space for preservation and ground water protection and the development of public recreational facilities.

2. RHODE ISLAND CLEAN WATER
FINANCE AGENCY -
WATER QUALITY MANAGEMENT
BONDS
\$60,000,000
(CHAPTER 55 - PUBLIC LAWS 2000)

Approval of this question will authorize the State of Rhode Island to issue general obligation bonds and refunding bonds in an amount not to exceed \$60,000,000 to provide funding for the Rhode Island Clean Water Finance Agency which will be leveraged with federal and state capitalization grants to provide loans at a subsidized rate of zero percent to municipalities, governmental entities and non-governmental entities for the construction, repair, equipping and upgrading of water pollution abatement projects including, but not limited to, wastewater treatment facilities, nutrient reduction, sewers, combined sewer overflow systems, restoration of aquatic habitats, and stormwater treatment and to provide subsidized interest rate loans to community water systems, both privately and publicly owned, and non-profit non-community water systems for drinking water projects.

3. TRANSPORTATION BONDS
\$62,510,000
(CHAPTER 55 - PUBLIC LAWS 2000)

Approval of this question will authorize the State of Rhode Island to issue general obligation bonds and refunding bonds in an amount not to exceed \$62,510,000 to match federal funds and fund improvements to the State's highways, roads and bridges and to purchase buses for the Rhode Island Public Transit Authority's fleet.

4. HIGHER EDUCATION BONDS
\$36,950,000
(CHAPTER 55 - PUBLIC LAWS 2000)

Approval of this question will authorize the State of Rhode Island to issue general obligation bonds and refunding bonds in an amount not to exceed \$36,950,000 to fund improvements to the University of Rhode Island, Rhode Island College and the Community College of Rhode Island.

5. HERITAGE HARBOR MUSEUM
BONDS
\$25,000,000
(CHAPTER 55 - PUBLIC LAWS 2000)

Approval of this question will authorize the State of Rhode Island to issue general obligation bonds and refunding bonds in an amount not to exceed \$25,000,000 for the creation, design, construction, furnishing and equipping of the Heritage Harbor Museum.

CO-EQUAL BRANCHES OF

(ADVISORY REFERENDUM)

Should a Constitutional Convention be called to expressly establish that Rhode Island government consists of separate and co-equal legislative, executive, and judicial branches similar to the governments established by the United States Constitution and by the Constitutions of all 49 other states?
